Christian County Health Department Shares Potential Community Exposure

The Christian County Health Department is sharing potential community exposure related to a positive COVID-19 case that resides in another county, but reported traveling to Christian County. The individual testing positive reported visiting Lambert's Cafe in Ozark on Friday, June 12th from 4:30-6:00 pm and again on Monday, June 15th from 9:00 am- 10:30 am. The individual reported that they were symptomatic and unmasked during both visits.

Anyone who visited this location during the timeframe listed is considered to be at low risk for contracting COVID-19, but should monitor for symptoms. There is no need to self-quarantine or isolate unless symptoms develop.

Symptoms of COVID-19 include:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

In order to help prevent or stop the spread of COVID-19 the health department encourages all citizens to:

- Stay at home if you are ill, and contact your physician
- Practice social distancing while out in the community
- Avoid large gatherings and crowded places
- Continue wearing a face mask or other face covering while out in public areas
- Practice good hand hygiene
