A second COVID-19 related death has been reported in Christian County

The Christian County Health Department is sad to report a second COVID-19 related death. The latest reported death was a male in his late 60s and he was reported to have underlying health conditions. The health department would like to express our sincerest condolences to the patient's family and loved ones.

Christian County has a total of five-hundred twenty-three (523) cases (four-hundred ninety-two (492) confirmed and thirty-one (31) probable). Thirty-two (32) probable cases were previously reported; however, one of the probable cases has been moved to a confirmed case due to a positive lab result being received. The health department is currently monitoring one-hundred ninety-seven (197) active cases. Christian County has two (2) COVID-19 related deaths.

Of the five-hundred twenty-three (523) total number of cases reported in Christian County, fifty-six (56) cases were reported between March 17th and June 30, 2020. During the month of July the health department received two-hundred thirty-eight (238) additional cases. So far, during the month of August, the health department has received an additional two-hundred twenty-nine (229) new cases.

Of the five-hundred twenty-three (523) total number of COVID-19 cases reported in Christian County since March 17th, eighteen (18) individuals have been hospitalized. At this time, eight (8) Christian County residents remain hospitalized with three (3) of those individuals currently on a ventilator. Not all of the hospitalized individuals had co-morbidities that contributed to their hospitalization.

Symptoms of COVID-19 include: · Fever or chills · Cough · Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing · Fatigue · Muscle or body aches · Headache · New loss of taste or smell · Sore throat · Congestion or runny nose

Anyone experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 should stay home and seek medical attention. With the recent significant increase in positive cases, the health department would like to remind the community that at this point-in-time there is a potential for you to be exposed at any public location. The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to the COVID-19 virus. The health department is urging all community members to wear a face mask during instances where staying more than six feet away from others is a challenge. The correct use of a face mask (having the face mask fully covering your mouth and nose) and the consistent use of a face mask will offer protection to people around you, especially those who are at higher risk of getting sick. Please keep in mind that you may be infected with COVID-19 without realizing it, so wearing a face mask correctly and consistently significantly reduces the risk that you will spread the virus to others unknowingly.
